CAP Money is a fantastic outreach tool that any church can use to impact their community. Many people are feeling the pinch and looking at how to reduce their expenses, meaning money

management and budgeting are at the top of their agenda. Through CAP Money, your church can reach out to give people the tools to deal with their finances at this crucial time. Running CAP Money reflects Jesus' heart as he taught so much about money. As his Church, we should do the same. Money affects so much of what we all do and if it is out of control, it has the power to destroy lives. CAP Money empowers people to give and save more as well as preventing the destructive effects of unmanageable debt.

The Mission of God - Part 2

We continue with The Mission of God, a year-long sermon programme in which we take a helicopter view of the whole Bible and aim to see the big picture of God's interaction with the world, and what it means for us. The basic idea is this: God has a mission to this world and calls us to join in. The aim of The Mission of God is to take us on a journey where we discover our part in the big story of God and his people, a story which goes back to the beginning of time, but which continues today. Based around nine

themes, the series looks in detail at nine actions of God which are consistent themes throughout the Bible, as well as being rooted at a particular point in the history of God's people.

Over this term we will look at the following four themes:

God Reigns - God wants His rescued people to build His kingdom on earth through kingdom values.

God Judges - God sees how His people are living, then and now and calls them to account.

God Comes - God takes human form in Jesus Christ and changes the way we see ourselves.

God Loves - God takes in Jesus Christ the decisive action to address the human condition.
