Please note our new arrangements for waste and recycling!

We have for many years recycled as much as we can here at Trinity. With the recent change in waste collection we are now classed as a 'commercial business' (no

charity rates unfortunately) and we now have to pay for the collection of our rubbish and recycling! This will mean a few changes to the way we sort our waste!

We will have two types of bins – food waste and recycling/residual! The **food waste bin** will be in the kitchen and emptied regularly. The **recycling bins** in the kitchen under the counter top (behind the door) will be for recycling and residual waste (this will include all normal recycling plus all other coloured plastic, hand-towels, polythene and any packaging!) A list of acceptable items are on the bins around the centre - so please check to make sure you put your rubbish in the correct bin ☺. **Glass** will still go under the sink in the kitchen and Andre will take this to recycling for us.

We want to take care of the environment so would ask that we all do our bit and put our waste in the correct bins around the church and centre. If you have any questions please speak to me. Thank you. Cynth
